INTER ASSOCIATION COMPETITION TEAM REPORTS

The 2019-20 representative cricket season was like none before it. Cricket NSW, under the NSW Youth Championships banner, assumed control of most of the junior competitions; those from under 12 to under 15 (both male & female), while abandoning the under 11 and under 16 age groups. The NSW Youth Championships competition involved more, shorter matches under different playing conditions and the addition of a second division to the under 12 & under 13 age groups. The senior men's Martin Shield and the under 16 Watson Shield continued under the control of the NSW District Cricket Association.

As well as these competitions Parramatta entered teams in the IDCA Presidents Cup for the first time. This competition catered for team aged under 11 (2 divisions) through to under 16.

15 representative teams competing in 17 competitions across 3 controlling bodies made for a lot of organising; personnel, MyCricket set-up, grounds, equipment and clothing particularly. Thanks to all who assisted, especially Justin Isaacs whose help was invaluable. While there certainly was considerable work and expense to this vastly expanded representative program the benefit to our young cricketers is undoubted. The increased opportunity to compete at a higher level and simply the opportunity of more cricket is always welcome. Hopefully all these competitions will be maintained for future seasons.

DCA & NSW YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIP COMPETITION REPORTS

MARTIN SHIELD

The DCA Martin Shield competition is representative cricket for all age men, Parra's team is drawn from our A Grade comp. In a short competition of three rounds, Parramatta finished on top with a bye and two wins.

Round 2, Parra defeated Sutherland by a massive 425 to 99. Pankaj Saini (106), Kane Milne (80) and Ainsley Scheerhoorn (74) starred with the bat while Blake Gilbert (4 for 16) and Chris Robertson (3 for 35) topped the bowling.

Round 3 was a closer game, Parra 7 for 233 running down Moore Park & South East's 9 for 229. Russell White, Kane Milne & Blake Gilbert took two wickets each. Blake's 96 and Russell's late 51 not out got us home.

In the qualifying final, Kane Milne (4 for 57) & Mark Paterson-Hill (3 for 26) limited Northern Cricket Union to 162, which Parra chased down in 33 overs, Kane's 63 & Russ White's 53 (off 20 balls!) sealing the win.

The semifinal against Hawkesbury saw Kane (2 for 44) & Mark (3 for 37) again hold the opposition to a gettable total of 202. All the batsmen made starts, but Puru Srinivasan's 71 not out saw Parra home 8 down.

The boys had made the home grand-final against Camden, undefeated and with high hopes. Unfortunately, as happens in cricket, sport, and life – things didn't go as hoped and planned. Sutha Senathipillay's late 55 runs gave our total of 130 some respectability, but Camden took their chances with the bat and prevailed on the day.

Our thanks go to Dan McMaster for taking on the Martin Shield campaign as the Captain, the team was well led and also well managed by John Stevenson – Thanks Emu! Vicki Paterson and Damien Hill scored each match and supported the team throughout, thanks you to both. Bringing this group together to represent Parramatta as well as they did is a credit to all these people.

Despite the disappointing end to the comp all involved enjoyed Sunday representative cricket against new opponents on different grounds. Hopefully we will be able to go around again.

Match 1 PDCC 6-218 def Penrith 5-213 by 5 runs

The season opened with a trip to Bradman Oval in Bowral to play against Penrith in the annual **Lou Benaud Cup match**. This was a great experience for the boys from both teams and both sets of players and parents appreciated the opportunity to play on such an iconic ground. The occasion certainly inspired both teams to put on a contest to match the setting. Parramatta batted first and recovered from the loss of early wickets to post a score of 6 for 218 off our 50 overs. An unbroken partnership of 66 between Anvay Gholkar (52no) and Robbie D'Angelo (30no) setting up the final score.

In the field, we were able to chip away taking wickets at regular intervals. However mid-way through the Penrith innings we suffered a setback with injury and cramp impacting the team. At one stage we were down to only 9 in the field. Things can go two ways when faced with a challenge like that and the response from the boys was to define the way we played the whole representative season. We dug deep and were able to get back to 11 on field inside the last 10 overs and we were still in the game. Superb bowling and fielding in the final 10 overs turned the match to bring back on level terms. In the end we were able to secure the win off the final ball of the day. Credit to both teams. This was 100overs of high-quality cricket. Anvay Gholkar with 3-30 to go with his 52no collected the player of the match award.

The character displayed in round 1 created a great level of self-belief within the group and set the scene for the season.

Again, our bowling and fielding was the real difference between the two teams. Robbie led the way with early wickets and our three-prong spin attack of Debasis, Luke and Raveen once again dried up the scoring mid innings putting Blacktown under enormous pressure to chase down the total.

This result saw us finish undefeated for the round games and secure the top spot and home ground advantage for the finals series.

After losing the toss and being asked to field, the boys were forced into a tough grind in the field as a result of some very disciplined batting by Hawkesbury. Robbie led the way with early wickets; the spinners again dried up the run rate and Pat mopped up the tail taking 5-28. A nervous start with the bat saw us at 4-63 before Jay and Josh guided as home with an unbeaten 88 run partnership. We now were up against a very strong Manly Warringah outfit in the semi-final.

Semi Final PDCC 163 def Manly Warringah 99 by 64 runs

we scrambled to 163. At the innings change we knew it was going to come down to how well we bowled and fielded. Once again, the boys lifted to another level. An aggressive opening spell from Anvay where he collected 3 early wickets set the scene. Important wickets to Shanuk and Pat kept the momentum running our way. A brilliant 10 over spell of 3-21 from Luke supported by some excellent fielding was too much for Manly and they were all out for 99.

Our next stop was the Watson Shield final against our round 1 opponents, Penrith.

This match saw the top 2 teams from the rounds up against each other in the final. Having played a cliff-hanger in round 1, expectations were high for another close contest. The boys from both teams did not disappoint. Both teams played hard throughout in a match fitting of a final.

We won the toss and batted. Penrith bowled and fielded superbly keeping us under pressure from the start. We struggled to get any real momentum, importantly we managed to bat out our 50 overs and reach a competitive score of 168. Special mention to the lower order who guided us from 6-100 to our final tally in the last 15 overs.

Unlike our semi-final start with the ball, we started slowly. Penrith cruised to 0-59 off 16 overs. However, spin once again was to change the momentum of the game and a wicket to Luke in his first over followed up by a wicket to Shanuk lifted our spirits. These two bowled 12 overs in tandem for 2-20 in a period which was highlighted by very disciplined bowling and high-quality fielding. From there we were able to stay in the contest with Raveen picking up two more vital wickets. At the final drinks break Penrith needed just 45 runs with 5 wickets in hand off 11 overs. From that point on Penrith were not given a sniff. Concerted pressure in the field backed up by accurate bowling, brilliant catching and two run outs resulted in us capturing the last 5 wickets for just 10 runs. It was a victory out of nowhere and caught Penrith totally off guard.

The final was a fitting conclusion to a memorable campaign. To finish the season undefeated with the Watson Shield was reward for the way the boys played and gelled as a team throughout the season. We were able to finds ways to get out of trouble; stay in contention by being prepared to tough it out, work together as a team and back ourselves and our team mates no matter what the situation of the match. That self-belief and team spirit more than anything contributed to the success. Well done boys.

The success on the field does not occur with support off the field. A big thank you to our manager Sumindre, scorer Tarak and all the parents who helped throughout the season. I believe it is fair to say the feedback from all our opponents was our lunches and hospitality was also top of the pack.

After coming out of the previous season with a strong foundation for success we were ready to take our performance to the top level. Our campaign was boosted with some strong inclusions to the playing group in the shape of 3 quality players from Northern districts in Krish Thakur, Jaden Sequeira and Shivam Wadhera. We also had an international recruit join us with Ben Edmonds and an addition to the coaching staff with Brett coming back to again transfer his knowledge with a PDCA junior team.

What transpired was a season with so much promise, but left us more than a little bit sour after everything seemed to be going ahead on track, only to find ourselves falling short of the level that was required to make the business end of the season and challenge for the title. No more was it evident from our season that close enough isn't good enough and the cruelness of our game when we realised that we had missed out on playing finals by 1 point. The difference being one run out decision on the last ball of a T20 game. You win some and you lose some. Get knocked

down 10 times, get up 11. What we learnt from this season, and we have all committed too as a team, as the gloves are off for coming season. We are all in, with whatever sacrifices and disciplines are required for the experience of success as a team in the Weblin Shield.

This year the Rep competition was run by Cricket NSW and was played under the banner of NSW Youth Championships with new rules, new formats with fielding restrictions. We had more games and starting two 20/20 games and seven 50 over games.

Round 1 we drew against our old nemesis North Shore, against whom we have had a few battles over the years and have always had very close encounters. This one was no different. We won the toss and batted first and made a competitive 5/105 in 20 overs. We then took regular wickets, however North Shore were composed enough to get over the line with 1 ball to spare. Boys took the loss in their stride and came back very strong against a depleted Northern Districts, scoring 2/145 in 20 overs and winning by comfortable margin of 46 runs.

Round 3 onwards we started our strength games – 50 over cricket which was the basis of our team selections. Round 3 was our first home game and was against a confident Hawkesbury (last year's finalists). We won the toss and sent Hawkesbury to bat. Hawkesbury put in a competitive 181. We started well with the bat and were cruising at 1/132, however Hawkesbury bounced back taking 5 wickets for 34 runs, but couldn't stop us from achieving the target with 6 down and 3 overs to spare.

Round 4 we travelled to Camden and the boys were full of confidence with 2 wins under their belt. We won the toss and sent Camden to bat. Boys bowled and field very well and restricted Camden to 114 and won comfortably with 21 overs to spare thus taking the bonus point.

Next up we were back at home against Blacktown. Blacktown the eventual runners up were a well drilled team like us and were in good form, both teams had the same win loss ratio. We won the toss as we did on all the previous occasions and sent Blacktown to bat. We bowled & fielded well to restrict Blacktown to 166 and were confident that we had the batting line-up to win the game. The wicket however had other plans and played totally different to the first innings, with variable bounce and the ball keeping low and not coming onto the bat. Playing first year on turf, the boys did not have experience to tackle that and lost by 28runs.

Next up we had Penrith and back to back home games. With a loss to Blacktown, the boys had a point to prove to the competition that were worthy to be taken seriously as title contenders. We won the toss, but chose to bat this time and had a excellent 1st innings, scoring 7/206, which was an excellent 50 over total. Although we had a rain scare, we were still strong enough make sure the game was over before the rain interruption, winning by winning by 49runs and narrowly missing the bonus point, which would haunt us later.

Round 8, we travelled to Bankstown full of confidence as we were topping our group after 7 rounds. We won the toss and elected to bat as the pitch was very soft and we expected it to deteriorate even further as the day progressed.
