This season saw the introduction of PlayHQ. Despite assurances it was ready to go, it proved to be totally inadequate to replace My Cricket. Continual improvements were made during the season, which made it slightly better. If it were not for the work of Mark Macdonald and Frank Pitt, the program would not have progressed. Still much work is needed before next season.

Whilst on this subject, PDCA was runner up in the Cricket Australia Awards in the Technology & Media Initiative of the Year section. Thanks to Mark Macdonald & Frank Pitt for all their work in assisting with upgrades to PlayHQ.

Congratulations to the Parramatta Grade Club on winning the First & Third Grade Premierships, as well as the AW Green Shield. A very successful season. Well done to all concerned.

The Representative season went very well, with PDCA successful in boys' competition in the U15 Weblin Shield & U12 Arch Cawsey Shield and in the girls' competition in the U15 Margaret Peden Shield. Thanks to Paul Giumelli and Justin Isaacs, who have again put in an amazing amount of time and effort to get the PDCA teams onto the park. Thanks to all coaches and managers for their work and to the Sponsors who have provided financial support. EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

The 2022-23 season has now come and gone without the disruptions of previous seasons. Without heatwaves, air quality issues, extended wet weather and resulting field damage, and without further impact from the pandemic, it was good to focus on playing the game. While we lost very little playing time to rain our season has been shortened by one weekend due to council policy changes, and will remain so.

Focusing on the field, congratulations to Club Champions, Seven Hills-Toongabbie RSL Cricket Club; A Grade Premiers, Wenty Leagues; all our premiership winning teams and our Senior and Junior Cricketers of the Year; Rob Pasfield and Neel Patel. Well Done All. Female participation continues strong growth and we were able to offer the inaugural Women's Senior comp. Overall player and team numbers were slightly down on 21-22.

Most of our cricket continues to be played in the right spirit and there were fewer judiciary matters heard than previously. Thank you to the Parramatta District Cricket Umpires Association for your members' work on the field and the hard work off the field by your officers. Your input and our two associations close relationship is of enormous benefit to cricket in Parramatta. My thanks also go to our volunteer committees; the Competitions Committee (Chaired by Cameron Laurie), the Judiciary Committee (Chaired by Michael Johns) and the Board (Chaired by Peter McLoughlin).

Parramatta DCA's representative program, under the excellent management of Paul Giumelli and Justin Isaacs continues to do the association proud, not only with the quality of the cricket played but with the inclusiveness, the professionalism and the spirit displayed on and off the field. Thanks also to the coaches and managers of all our representative teams. You, Paul and Justin are owed the gratitude of this association and our rep players and their parents.

Congratulations to our Margaret Peden Shield, E.G. Weblin Shield and Arch Cawsey Shield premiers in the NSW Youth Championships and our Anthony Neale Cup and Colin Cooper Cup (Div 2) premiers in the IDCA Presidents Cup Competitions. Congratulations too to *all* player selected to represent their district.

Testament to the quality of our representative program is the success of our partner NSW Premier Cricket clubs, the Parramatta District Cricket Club and the Parramatta District Women's Cricket Club. These clubs are filled with former PDCA juniors well prepared for the rigours of Premier Cricket. Congratulations to Parra DCC on winning the First Grade, Third Grade and Green Shield premierships and running up in the Club Championship and Fourth Grade, with very creditable results in each of the remaining four competitions. The Parra Women's CC finished second in the Club Championship and were finalists in First Grade, Second Grade and Brewers Shield.

While on-field disruptions were absent, off the field the Cricket Australia mandated move to the PlayHQ platform resulted in unprecedented disruption and difficulties for the administration and management of cricket. The platform is simply not fit for purpose and was not ready for adoption. Despite promises of a reduced volunteer workload, PlayHQ demanded a manifold increase in the contribution of everyone. We experienced a decimation of the volunteer base as good people, deeply invested in the successful running of clubs and competitions, walked away from the roles and the sport they loved over the frustration and often impossible demands imposed by PlayHQ. Player registrations suffered as did teams' capacity to offer casual players the odd game of cricket. Usually, offering a "taste" of one or a few games leads to fuller participation or a next season commitment. PlayHQ's one-size-fits-all registration model and cost structure closed this option and many, many teams played short. The problems of PlayHQ were such that as our competitions closed on the final rounds, the PDCA Board learned that we could not have confidence in the match results and scores, or competition ladders as published on PlayHQ at that time. There was considerable backroom work by our Board and Comps Committee to maintain the integrity of the competitions.

There will be improvement as Cricket NSW and others work to make the platform better. PDCA Board member Mark Macdonald (Winston Hills C.C.) has made a huge contribution in this regard; endlessly liaising and advising Cricket NSW, C.A. and PlayHQ, while helping the association and other clubs navigate the difficulties. All cricket owes Mark thanks.

In this report last season, I was honoured to wish Doug D'Arney well in his retirement. Doug had been a giant of our game in Parramatta and NSW, as a player, an umpire, a volunteer and a supporter. He umpired much Premier Cricket including more than one hundred First Grade matches and countless PDCA matches at our highest level. Doug served on the PDCA Board and the PDCUA Committee (including as President) for decades and earned Life Membership of both associations. Tragically, Doug passed away suddenly just prior to Christmas 2022. Vale Doug.

Our Association enjoys substantial financial support from Kookaburra, which effectively lowers the cost of participation for every player. That support deserves our appreciation and thanks.

New sponsorship arrangement for our representative junior program saw Trikon, Edgegenix, Sydney Wide Shutters and Cherry Custom Apparel come on board with significant contributions. Their help is much appreciated.

FINANCIAL OFFICER'S REPORT

The purpose of this report is to explain various items of Income and Expenditure listed in the Financial Statements.

Affiliation Cost- Both Seniors and Juniors Affiliation cost were increased for the Season 2022/2023. With the increase in cost it is expected that Affiliation Fees may increase for the Season 2023/2024.

Cricket NSW took control of Junior Representative Cricket from NSWDCA and Player Fees were introduced to cover match expenses (grounds, umpires, balls etc) and clothing. Expenses pertaining to Watson and Martin Shields were still incurred separately.

Fines- There were fines imposed for Player Umpire Non-Attendance, Forfeit of Team and Judiciary appeal.

Ground Rental: As mentioned in the previous year's Financial Report, there was an increase in cost for the Ground Fees.

Umpire Fee- There was significant increase in umpiring fees PDCUA umpires.

Insurance – Juniors: Cricket NSW via My Cricket assumed control of Player Insurance payments in respect of Juniors. It is anticipated that Senior Player Insurance may increase for the next season.

Sponsorship: Kookaburra Sports have been most generous sponsors of PDCA. We anticipate they will continue their sponsorship but given the current economic conditions we expect it will be limited to the agreed \$10,000 per season. For the Season 2022/2023 PDCA received sponsor of from EDGEGENIX, TRIKON and Kamal Pawar.

Administration Grants- No changes to the Executive and Finance Officers.

Software- The annual cost of this software is approximately \$600.

Financial Status- PDCA finances are in a healthy state with a bank balance of \$124,100.30 at season's end. We are expecting to pay Honorarium Payments approximately \$5,000 for the season ending 2022/2023. Normal offseason expenditure for administration and trophies should result in a balance of approximately \$120,000 to start the 2023-24 season.
