All three of our under 13 teams won their competitions; the Molly Dive Shield Girls, the Gee Shield division 1 and the Creak Shield division 2 boys. Our all-age men's team won the DCA Martin Shield, and the under 17 Watson Shield fell a solitary run short in their nail biting DCA grand final. The under 15 Margaret Peden Shield girls and our Presidents' Cup under 14 teams also reached their grand finals, finishing runners up.

## DCA & NSW YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIP COMPETITION REPORTS

## MARTIN SHIELD All age mens

Coming off the back of a comprehensive defeat to the Harlem Globetrotters of Martin Shield, Camden last season, the boys were keen to get one back over them this year.

However, the campaign couldn't have started much worse if we tried. Given 6 days' notice that we would be putting a side in, we drew the defending premiers away in Round 1. This sent us into complete damage control to even put a side on the park. With help from various clubs across various divisions we managed to scrape together 11 bodies to go to Camden on a Sunday morning and get comprehensively flogged by a much much much better side.....and didn't they let us know about it.

Round 2 versus Sutherland was a better affair with 8 changes made to the previous weeks side. Batting first we scored 260 and rolled them with 83. The highlight of the day being Angus Carroll being denied a hat-trick in his first over for the season. At one stage he had impressive figures of 2/2 off just one ball bowled.

Round 3 we had another trip out to Camden to face their Colts side who earned a late call up into the big leagues. On a wet Sunday the boys clinically dispatched of the younger opposition to get back on track towards the finals.

Round 4 versus Moore Park & South East was right around the time that we realized we might be a really good shout to give this comp and the Harlem globetrotters a red hot crack this year. Batting first at McCredie we quickly raced out to 0/110 in the 12<sup>th</sup> over courtesy of Grant McCartin and Dan

Chatman. We didn't look back and went on to post just shy of 350 and rolled them comprehensively for a 200 run victory. This locked in second place and a home final against Northern Suburbs.

Semi Final time and with a favorable toss won, we reduced Northern Suburbs to 121 all out. Our seamers really led the way, Grant 4 Josh Mann 2 and Matt Sibley 2 all chipped in on a tough deck to bat on. A top order collapse saw us reduced to 4/30 before Luke Yarnold and Matt Windred added an unbeaten 65 run partnership to see us into a Grand Final.

We set out as our first game as a unit to give this competition a red hot crack and nothing less, knowing on paper we had the side to do it.....it's all useless unless we got the job done. This Grand Final would be one of the most bizarre, topsy turvy games of cricket witnessed in many moons. It began the week before as we sat around refreshing MyCricket for 2 hours after our game following the other Semi Final over by over.
